The NAME OF THE PUBLISHER can be found on the copyright page (also called the VERSO page). This is usually found on the back of the title page.

- ✓ Main Character(s): includes the protagonist(s) and antagonist(s)
- ✓ Setting: includes time and place
- ✓ Theme: the message
The THEME is the idea or concept that is central to the story.
- ✓ Author's Purpose
- ✓ Plot Summary: A paragraph describing the order of events in the story. Use complete sentences and good grammar. Be sure to include:
 - exposition
 - conflict - What is the problem within the story?
 - rising action
 - climax
 - falling action
 - resolution

Please follow these guidelines. Check them off before you turn in your display.

- ✓ Is your writing neat and easy to understand?
- ✓ Are your sentences complete?
- ✓ Did you use your imagination? Did you make it interesting and creative?
- ✓ Does your project reflect all the aspects of your book?

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- ✓ Did you follow directions?
 - ✓ Is your project durable (no pieces falling off)?
 - ✓ Did you write about the most important information?
 - ✓ Do you understand what the author is trying to say in the story?
 - ✓ Does your project make others want to read the book?
 - ✓ Did you do the work yourself?
